










In parts of Mississippi, gas stations serve an unlikely place in the culinary scene: They're a good place to get a meal. (No, seriously.) They're accessible and affordable options in places where supermarkets and restaurants are sometimes scarce or too expensive. In a state where 65



of the 82 counties are considered to be rural, the nearest grocery store could be more than 10 miles away, making gas stations a surprising dining hub for locals and travelers alike. Drawing from regional influences, some gas station owners have gotten creative with their offerings and added their own family recipes in changing daily menus.

OXFORD

In the college town of Oxford, at the intersection of North and South Lamar Boulevards and University, the chicken on a stick at the 4 Corners Chevron is a local icon. (We shit you not.) It's good too. Yeah, it's obviously considered drunk food, but it's also one that pulls in college kids and locals to this small 24-hour convenience store. There's a buffet-style counter that offers a bunch of fried snacks, like the ones you might find at the state fair: egg rolls, potato wedges. The chicken on a stick is a giant breaded and deep-fried chicken tender on, well, a stick for \$6. Tip: Don't go when there's an Ole Miss football game since the place will be A MOB SCENE.

For a wildly different experience, the Marketplace at Oxford Commons is just beyond campus in a Shell station. Their menu includes chicken pot pie like your mom makes (without the guilt trips), tacos and fresh shrimp from the coast.







DELTA

The Mississippi Delta, that 200-mile region of land between the Mississippi and Yazoo rivers in Northwest Mississippi, is a culturally and agriculturally rich area that is the birthplace of blues legends like B.B. King and Robert Johnson, and has a long history of cotton, rice

and corn farming, but is short on food options. Convenience stores, which include gas stations, accounted for 32% of the food options in the Delta, compared with grocery stores making up 4%, according to a study offered from the National Library of Medicine.

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













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
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LELAND


In Leland, Miss., a small town with a population of about 4,000 where Muppets creator Jim Henson spent his formative years, Fratesi Grocery and Service Station is the go-to for locals. Fratesi's was opened by Italian immigrants and serves a mix of Italian and New Orleans-style foods. The afternoon menu board includes sandwiches like













TUPELO

The three locations of Papa V's convenience store in Elvis' birthplace of Tupelo are known locally for their stand-out barbecue. Served in what is essentially a downtown gas station/deli/ convenience store/barbecue restaurant, they offer ribs, wings, biscuits, fried catfish sandwiches - crunchy cornmeal-breaded filets of Mississippi farm-raised fish — and more. The offerings change often, but include chicken and dumplings and black-eyed peas. The convenience store even sells craft beers from Lazy Magnolia Brewery and Natchez Brewing Co. If it weren't for the line of people buying cigarettes and lottery tickets, you'd forget you were eating in a gas station.
